WWII Veteran Celebrates Epic 99th Birthday



Joe Lavinger from Bethlehem, PA was born on Wednesday, July 18<sup>th</sup>, 1923. Some of the things that were happening at that time changed our lives forever.

- Greece becomes the last European country to adopt A Gregorian calendar.
- Time magazine is published.
- Firestone Tire and Rubber begins production of balloon tires.
- Insulin becomes available for diabetes.
- Yankee Stadium opens.
- The first 24 hours of La Mans was held.
- Checker taxi cabs were put on the street.
- The Hollywood sign was dedicated.
- The first US airship took flight (the USS Shenandoah).
- Walt Disney Co. was founded by Walt Disney.
- Turkey becomes a Republic.
- Hitler's rise to power when he attempted to seize power from Germany.

This coup is known as the Beer Hall Putsch", which failed. Joe would be meeting Hitler's force about 18 years later.

Today, we can't imagine life without all the inventions that have happened during Joe's lifetime. Joe made it through, as a teen, he was drafted into the Navy to join the fight in WWII. He served on the USS Steady which was a minesweeper. Maybe that's when he developed his comedy, to help calm the nerves of his shipmates.

After the War, he found himself in entertainment as a singer, musician, comedian, and talent agent.

Joe had a dance band for 55 years in the Columbus area. I think it's the longest running band in Columbus. As a talent agent, he was booking shows for acts such as the Glen Miller Band, Tommy Dorsey Band, as well as comedians such as Jackie Gleason and others.

## Agent Orange



Agent Orange was first sprayed in August 1961. President Kennedy had authorized the use of herbicides in December 1961, and the U.S. Air Force began flying Operation Ranch Hand missions the following month. Between 1962 and 1971, the U.S. sprayed an estimated 20 million gallons of herbicides in Vietnam, eastern Laos, and parts of Cambodia, usually from helicopters or low-flying aircraft, but sometimes from backpacks, boats, and trucks. Agent Orange is the most infamous herbicide and its lingering toxicity continues to affect those exposed on either side of the conflict.

## What We Do Everyday



A veteran applied to us for assistance, referred by the VA. He asked for prompt rental help. His wife developed a leg infection and is in the hospital following leg amputation. Both he and his wife are on Social Security disability – he can't work and now she cannot. Her check was garnished for previous overpayment and they cannot meet their overdue rent – facing eviction while she's hospitalized and

they have a 17 year old daughter at home. **Veterans' Outreach was able to help him with his rent.**

A veteran came to our office for help with a problem that he couldn't face alone. After we took care of him, he was so grateful he wanted to give back. He wanted to donate a hospital bed. We were unable to take it because we are crunched for space, but we told him we'd keep his information. Two weeks later, a veterans' caseworker called, said she was frantically searching for a hospital bed for a veteran that was in stage 4 cancer. **We were able to coordinate with the donor, the family of the veteran in need, and other agencies to get the hospital bed delivered. The family members assembled it, and as a bonus, we provided the veteran's wife with a walker. This is the kind of work we do every day, and we are grateful to be able to do it.**



### Navajo Code Talkers 2022 American Spirit Award Recipients

In the heat of battle, it is of the utmost importance that messages are delivered and received as quickly as possible. It is even more crucial that these messages are encoded so the enemy does not know about plans in advance. During World War II, the Marine Corps used one of the thousands of languages spoken in the world to create an **unbreakable code: Navajo**. World War II wasn't the first time a Native American language was used to create a code. During World War I, the Choctaw language was used in the transmission of secret tactical

messages. It was instrumental in a successful surprise attack against the Germans. Germany and Japan sent students to the United States after World War I to study Native American languages and cultures, such as Cherokee, Choctaw, and Comanche. Because of this, many members of the U.S. military services were uneasy about continuing to use Code Talkers during World War II. They were afraid the code would be easily cracked, but that was before they learned about the complexity of Navajo.
