Veterans' Outreach New Headquarters



A little less than a year ago, I would have never dreamed that we would be moving into a complex that has three large brick buildings and almost three acres! Thanks to the support of all of you that have donated online, participated in special events, donated at our Outreach setups, volunteered, donated goods for the VO Depot – all of you that have believed in the mission – thank you for helping us help veterans.

In November 2022, the Executive Director was interviewed by a Youngstown TV station. He was delighted to present her with a plaque saying that she was voted "Hometown Hero" of the Valley. The way that she has been helping thousands of veterans each year has been inspirational. In the interview, she was asked what Veterans' Outreach needed the most. She proceeded to tell the viewing audience that the biggest pressing need of Veterans' Outreach was to get a larger building which we've been looking for... for three years and better.

That interview inspired two realtors to alert us to a nearby property located at 15, 17,

and 19 Colonial Drive in Youngstown that was up for auction the next day! We went to the auction, and no one else did. It was the grace of God that brought these circumstances together. The complex that we purchased is a godsend to our growth pattern orchestrating stronger, better, and more missions.

So, we have been renovating the new site to suit our programs for veterans. We will be moving into an 18,000 sq. ft. building from a 3,600 sq. ft. building. The two other buildings were built for office rentals. One of them is full and the other will be used for storage and who knows what the future holds.

We have just had the soft opening of our newest venture, the VO Depot. It is a thrift shop that sells just about everything and anything from cars, collectibles, furniture, appliances, and every kind of clothing that you can imagine. The best part is that the sales will directly benefit veterans through the Direct Aid Program which provides financial assistance for veterans in need.

The other side of the building will have a large waiting area where veterans can visit one another and enjoy an atmosphere of acceptance and appreciation. It will also have the Freedom Food Pantry for veterans, the Direct Aid Program, and a guest office for other veteran supportive services.

The second floor will house our administrative needs and a large open area for future events. The updates are completed but need to be painted.

We hope to be fully moved by the end of November. A grand opening will have to wait until we get the outside completed with flag and exterior renovations to the buildings. Being a non-profit, we are very careful about expenditures outside of day-to-day operations. We have applied for grant funding to update and rehab the exterior.
