INDEPENDENCE – WHAT IS IT?

Independence means having the freedom to make choices for our own destiny, free from the control and influences of others. Veterans have paid and continue to pay for our freedoms. Can we all wrap our heads around that?

My name is John Ely. Although I never served in the military, I am proud to say that I have dedicated the last 30 years of my life to helping and honoring our veterans. It is the least I can do, and it's my way of paying it forward.

My father, my brother, my son, and my son-in-law have all served, and many have lived with the mental and physical scars of their service. My passion for supporting veterans has been the driving force behind the foundation of this wonderful charity, a mission I believe God has called me to pursue for the rest of my life.

Millions of citizens have experienced their loved ones' suffering from their service, in protecting our nation's borders. We all need to pause, reflect, and find that passiondriven forward by our loved ones and friends. When a family member serves, we all serve. When they hurt, we hurt or suffer.

That's why I do what I do. I witnessed and felt the despair of seeing my loved ones go through their sufferings. They don't even complain as you might expect. They're just happy to be here, grateful for what they have left. Wow!

My father, a Pearl Harbor Survivor, has an incredible story of survival during that catastrophic, world-changing event. Stationed at Hickam Field, he was on the front porch when the bombing began. As a medic, he immediately hopped into his ambulance truck and started driving, not knowing where he was going. His truck was strafed twice by a Zero until it crashed into a crater from a previous bomb, where he received burns. The bombing lasted just 75 minutes at 7:55 in the morning. Despite his wounds, he took care of himself first, then his commanding officer told him to leave the dead and focus on the wounded.

For the next four days and nights, he stayed up, rescuing many men from the burning waters and getting them to the hospital at Hickam. The hospital was filled, and most were laid outside until they could be taken care of. For the rest of his life, my dad could never sleep more than three hours a night, reliving that nightmare for most of his 82 years. My dad, William Gordon Ely, should have received the Medal of Honor.

When I suggested we pursue the Medal of Honor for his actions, he humbly said that many other soldiers deserved it more than he did. My dad's humility is one of the greatest lessons he passed down to me. My service now is a way to honor his memory, as well as the memory of my brother and other relatives who paid for their mental and physical health.

My son Ben, a Major in the Army, just had his third operation from his time in service. Most recently, he underwent surgery for his broken back. Despite all he has endured, he still serves in the military. After 20 years, he still has the drive to finish the mission, knowing that peace is fleeting and the mission is never truly done. Through Veterans' Outreach, I hope and pray that we will always be here to answer the call of duty for our men and women who have served.
